


Brown Bear, Brown Bear What Do You See?

























Create a Hibernating Bear Den


Bears hibernate during winter cozying up in a den to sleep the cold months away. Your child can learn more about bears and hibernating by making his own creative and comfy den. He can use his finished den while pretending to hibernate through the long cold winter months!

What you need:

- A large box about 3 feet by 3 feet
- Packing tape
- Brown paint
- · Large paintbrush
- Scissors
- · Blankets and pillows

What you do:

- Share a story with your child about bears and hibernation such as *Time to Sleep* by Denise Fleming or *Bear Snores On* by Karma Wilson. After reading about bears, discuss hibernation and see if he knows any other animals that hibernate during the winter months.
- 2. First, help your child seal the box with packing tape.
- 3. Invite your child to help create the den by painting the outside of the big box. He can use a large paintbrush and brown paint to transform the box into a cave encouraging his imagination!
- 4. While the box cave is drying he can look for pillows and cozy blankets to place inside the cave along with having a nice snack to help him stay full, just like a bear does before hibernating. Bears love to eat nuts and berries before their long sleep, so a bowl of mixed nuts and cut berries might be in order!
- 5. Help your child by cutting a large hole in the side of the box for him to use for getting in and out of his bear cave.
- 6. Now your child can find the perfect spot to position his cave for hibernating. Encourage him to curl up inside and see if he's ready to hibernate!

Polar Bear Craft

Polar bears love chilly weather! Winter is a great time for your child to create his very own textured polar bear. Not only will your child gain practice identifying shapes, he'll put his fine motor skills to work drawing and cutting them out. After the project is complete he'll have an adorable companion to give him warm fuzzies throughout the season.

What You Need:

- Paper plate
- Cotton balls
- Black and white construction paper
- Scissors
- Pencil
- · Glue stick

What You Do:


- Ask your child to name the shape of a paper plate. Place the plate in front of him.
- 2. Encourage him to name the shape of the end of a cotton ball. Explain the difference between a circle and an oval. Have him cover the entire paper plate in cotton balls, gluing them directly to the plate.
- 3. Have him draw and cut out two black circles for his bear's eyes, and two large white circles for the bear's ears.
- 4. Help him glue the circles in place.
- 5. Ask him if he can draw an oval on the black paper to create the polar bear's nose. Cut it out and glue it in place.
- 6. Ask if he can count the number of circles he drew and cut out. What about the number of ovals?



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





hat Can I Do hen I'm Feeling Scared?

We feel scared when we are in danger or when we are unsure about doing something we haven't done before. Sometimes being scared can be exciting (like going on a ride at a theme park) but, at other times, being scared isn't a nice feeling.

Take slow, deep breaths until I feel calm again.

Laugh and point at things that scare me.



Talk to an adult I trust about what is making me scared.



Draw a picture of the thing that scares me and turn it into something funny.

Say very clearly to myself 'I am scared but I can do this'.

Think about the time when the scary thing will be over.



To make your book of brown, first write your name. Then, use brown to trace the words and color the pictures. When you are done, cut the pages on the dotted lines and have your parent staple them together!



1 slice of bread

Chocolate spread

- 3 banana slices
- 3 blueberries

Equipment

Toaster

Plate

Knife

Method

- 1. Lightly toast the slice of bread.
- 2. Once cooled slightly, spread on the chocolate spread.
- 3. Carefully place the banana onto the chocolate spread. Use 1 slice of banana for a nose and 2 slices of banana as the ears of the bear.
- 4. Put a dab of chocolate spread onto a blueberry, and place the blueberry in the center of the slice of banana that is the bear's nose. Place the 2 remaining blueberries between the ears and nose to make eyes.







bear




A bear is a mammal that has a large body, heavy fur, short hands and feet, and a small tail.

woods




The woods are closely packed trees that make a forest.
